Notice of the Annual General Meeting for the 2019-2020 Season

Please be advised that the Annual General Meeting to report on the club's activities this season and to prepare for the start of the 2020/2021 season will take place at 11am, Sunday 2nd August, 2020 at North Palm Beach SLSC.

Due to health and safety concerns and current restrictions relating to COVID19 there will be some changes to arrangements for this year's AGM:

- 1) The 2020 AGM will be conducted at the surf club and members can also join in by Zoom conferencing. We need to know if members eligible to vote and wanting to participate in the 2020 AGM intend on coming to the surf so we can ensure we comply with the social distancing guidelines. If there are more people wanting to attend in person than we can accommodate due to the social distancing guidelines then there will be option to join by Zoom. Zoom log-in information will be sent out to members by email.
- 2) To allow the committee to organize the AGM we need members to notify the club by email if they intend to either come to the club or participate by Zoom by 5pm Wednesday 29 July, 2020. The email address is office@northpalmbeach.com.au
- 3) This will also be the close off date for those members eligible to vote and wanting to participate in the 2020 AGM need to renew their membership for the upcoming 2020-21 season. There will not be any money collected by cash or eftpos on the morning of the AGM. This notice contains information about renewing your membership for the 2020/2021 season.
- 4) Please note, that due to concerns about the economic impact of COVID19 for some families and the disruption for all members towards the end of the season, the committee have set the membership fee for all members for the 2020-21 season at \$5.00 per person. When renewing online please ignore the fee schedule on the website all member renewals are \$5.00 per member for the 2020-21 season.
- 5) The date 5pm Wednesday 29 July, 2020 will also be the close of date for nominations for positions on the Management Committee/ Board of Directors and for proxy voting forms. - 6) For those members intending to participate in the AGM by Zoom the committee recommends that you also submit a completed proxy form directed to the Chair in case of any internet or technological difficulties that may disrupt connection to the meeting. Please note that current SLS policy defines members eligible to vote at the AGM as Life Members and current Long Service Members, Active Reserve Members, Active Members

and Associate Members elected to a Management Committee position. All surf lifesaving club memberships expire on April 30 each year and all members need to renew their memberships after that date. Details for renewal are below.

The Committee encourages all members to use the online facility to renew and pay their membership. North Palm Beach Surf Lifesaving Club has now been using online sign-up, renewal and payment system for many years.

President's Report

We enjoyed yet another successful season of lifesaving activity at North Palm Beach. As always, our number one priority has been to patrol our beach and I can proudly say it's been another great year of no lives lost on our watch. Our club served the community with professionalism and enthusiasm, especially with the challenges thrown at us this season with bush fires, drought, floods, COVID-19 and toilet paper shortages.

Due to COVID-19 we have been working towards restructuring the way we handle the new social distancing measures and regulations that at times have been challenging but we thank all club members for doing their very best during this difficult ever-changing time. At this



time, I would like to acknowledge the efforts of Graham Howard in preparing and maintaining the club to comply with the new COVID-19 Safety Plan which has allowed us to reopen the club to the members.

With such low patrolling membership numbers at North Palm Beach, we were once again able to receive assistance from Palm Beach SLSC with boosting our numbers on patrol thanks to Ben Neighbor, their club captain. I'd like to give a big thanks to all those who did more than their rostered patrols to get us through the season, especially Matt Gambold and Warren Howard.

This season we saw the introduction of drones in our branch. I congratulate Matt Gambold and Adam Crowley who obtained their UAV operators award and are now operating drones for the branch.

This season we saw the inclusion of our RWC (Sea-Doo Spark jet ski) to our list of standard equipment used on patrol, not to replace the IRB, but to work alongside it. I believe we could be the first club in Australia to use this vital piece of rescue equipment at club level. As well as Support Ski operators in our club that can operate our RWC, we have had several members in training to operate this craft so they will be ready for the upcoming season. Thanks to Warren Howard who has been training our new operators.

This off season, SLSSNB have been operating the regular RWC Support Ski new operator training and the proficiency training at North Palm Beach again as they have been doing every off season. We store, launch and retrieve about seven jet skis every Saturday and Sunday during the training period.

Like all volunteer organisations, North Palm Beach SLSC are fortunate to have many committed people who give up their time to keep the club running. Many of the activities are carried out quietly behind the scenes. These include the small team that seek grants and

funding to support the club. Home & Away and the Canteen are the major sources of income to the club each year. Graham Howard, Bob Cox, Kerry Traynor, Brian De Bono, Matt Gambold, Mack Apps-Tulip and many more also work behind the scenes often starting at 5:00am and finishing late at night to assist with Home & Away. Sarah Adorjany, Graham Howard, Michelle Howard along with other club members continue to work in the Canteen all year round.

I appreciate and thank our Patron and Life Member Jeff Conan for the wisdom and sage advice he provided to the club and for all the work he does with the maintenance of the building.

I would like to also thank the committee, especially Warren Howard, Bill Morell, Luke Symonds and Terry Kirkpatrick who gave me great support throughout the season. In addition, I would also like to thank the staff at the Branch and State Centre for the support they provide to the club throughout the season. Finally, I would like to thank those companies and organisations that support the club and surf lifesaving through their sponsorships and donations.

It is with great anticipation I look forward to our coming 2020-21 season as we enter our 75th season of protecting the public coming to the northern end of Palm Beach

Director of Finance Report

It gives me great pleasure to present the North Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club's financial report for the 2019-2020 year. I have summarised the major financial data below with comparison to prior year below:



As shown, the Club incurred a loss for the 2019-2020 financial year amounting to \$59,475. This is compared to a loss in the 2018-2019 year of 7,601. The difference between the loss from the previous year compared to the loss of this year is \$51,874.

Total income increased by \$7,780 largely due to Profit on Sale of Plant and Equipment (Toyota 4WD and Can Am) as well as receipt of sponsorship monies.

Total Expenditure increased by \$59,654 which was due, in part to increases in cleaning costs, Bookkeeping (General Administration) costs, Canteen Wages, Depreciation which was slightly offset by a decrease in General Expenses.

Whilst the club incurred a loss for the year it is worth noting that total cash increased by \$41,586 throughout this financial year.

We, like most volunteer organisations in the ever-changing social environment struggle to find volunteers to not only patrol on the beach but also to volunteer in other areas of the club, such as in the canteen.

The Club has found it necessary to employ one full time employee to manage the day-to-day food handling operations of the club in order to allow other personnel to provide the necessary service to Seven Network (Home and Away).

Additionally, the task of maintaining the cleanliness of the Club in order for the Club to be used by Home and Away and to meet health regulations and the expectations of our members has required the Club to engage an independent cleaning contractor.

These costs, in the absence of volunteers, come as a cost to the Club and are reflected in our financial statements.

A few exciting (well, for me as Treasurer) improvements occurred throughout the year

- This financial year saw the implementation of the Club holding a debit card, linking that card to its own bank account to minimise risk of fraud as well as reducing the need for cash to be held at the club.
- Cash handling procedures were tightened throughout the year utilising the two safes within the club. This included maintaining a float at the end of the day for the cash till with excess monies over and above the till float stored in the safes.
- The Club also implemented MYOB Essentials, a cloud-based accounting software that enables invoices to be scanned and loaded into the software, direct links to our bank accounts for retrieving bank transactions as well as enabling our auditors to access the software and digitally undertake the audit seeing all transactions and journals.

A special thank you to the Committee as well as to our auditors, KH Perry & Co for once again, undertaking the audit of our financials this year.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW. The committee has determined that the Association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirement of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 112: Income taxes AASB 1031: Materiality

AASB 110: Events after the balance sheet date

AASB 1004: Government grants

No other Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus View or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

a. Income Tax

The income tax expense (revenue) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income). The Association does not apply deferred tax.

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at the end of the reporting period. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

Non-member income of association is only assessable for tax, as member income is excluded under the principle of mutuality.

The Association is registered for Goods and Services Tax and charges GST on its taxable supplies and is entitled to claim input tax credits as and when paid.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2020

NOTE I: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the Association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the entity reviews the carrying values of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, is compared to the asset's carrying value. Any excess of the asset's carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the income statement.

d. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

e. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

f. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the assets and liabilities statement are shown inclusive of GST.

Report on the Financial Report

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of North Palm Beach Surf Life Saving Club Inc. (the Association), which comprises the Assets and Liabilities Statement as at 31 March 2020 for the year then ended, the Income and Expenditure Statement, a Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, other explanatory notes and the statement by members of the committee.

Committee's Responsibility for the Financial Report
